
Church of St John the Baptist, Tisbury

Sunday 10th May 2020 The Fifth Sunday of Easter





'Let us remember all the men in all the services, the women in all the services, who have laid down their lives. We have come to the end of our tribulation and they are not with us at the moment of our rejoicing.' King George VI. These words are taken from his speech to the nation on VE day at 9pm on 8th May 1945. Some of you reading this will remember this day vividly. Yesterday I met a lady in St John's churchyard who told me she remembered being with her father, carried on his shoulders, within a huge crowd, being swept along from Oxford Street to Piccadilly Circus. 'All the men were crying and all the church bells were ringing,' she recounted. Many must have cried that day for those they had lost that never came home. Everyone of course rejoiced that the war in Europe was over, but it was with heavy hearts for many with the remembrance of the sacrifice made. Last night, 75 years later, at exactly the same time as her father had, Her Majesty the Queen addressed the nation. She spoke about how she vividly recalls the jubilant scenes she witnessed with her sister, her parents and Winston Churchill from the balcony at Buckingham Palace. The sense of joy everywhere was profound, she recounted. We have

not been able to mark this 75th anniversary as we would wish, due to Covid 19 restrictions, but as our Queen emphasised, '... our streets are filled with love and care for each other.' For that we can give thanks.

In our Gospel reading today, Jesus gently encourages his disciples to trust in him; and we are his disciples today. He encourages us that whatever happens he has prepared a place for us to be at the end of our earthly lives and that he is our Way, our Truth and our Life. The message of VE day 75 years ago was 'Never give up, never despair,' and this is just as apt for us today. As Vera Lynn sings, 'We'll meet again, Don't know where, Don't know when, But I know we'll meet again some sunny day.'

The New Testament Reading: Acts 7.55-end

The Gospel: John 14.1-14

"Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also.

And you know the way to the place where I am going." Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. If you know me, you will know my Father also. From now on you do know him and have seen him." Philip said to him, "Lord, show us the Father, and we will be satisfied." Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and you still do not know me? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father?' Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own; but the Father who dwells in me does his works. Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; but if you do not, then believe me because of the works themselves.

Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father. I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If in my name you ask me for anything, I will do it.
