The 6th Sunday of Easter (Rogation)

Today and in the next few weeks we have much to celebrate! This wonderful painting by the contemporary French artist Miki de Goodaboom depicts the Ascension, when Jesus, raised from the dead, ascended into heaven and took his seat at the right hand of God the Father. We celebrate this on Thursday, forty days after Easter. As we shall read then, this was the end of Jesus' physical life on earth. In today's Gospel passage, we hear Jesus preparing the disciples for his departure. He assures them that, although they'll no longer physically see him, he'll still be with them. He won't leave them as orphans. A part both of his Father and of them, he will give them life; he and his Father will love those who love him. Moreover, he promises that the Holy Spirit will come and be with them for ever.

This is very heartening at a time when some of us are feeling very much alone. Jesus isn't with us as a physical, flesh-and-blood human being, but he is in us and we in him; the Holy Spirit is with us for ever, as he was with the disciples. We are not alone.

Just as God provides for us spiritually and emotionally, he provides for our physical needs, too. This afternoon, we celebrate God's creation and the abundance of good food he provides for us in a special service for Rogation. Traditionally, this is the time when we ask God's blessing on the crops, but we also extend our prayers to livestock, and to all who work the land.

At a time when, for many, spirits are low, it's good to be reminded of God's presence with us and of the good things of life. May his blessing rest on each one of us this week and in the weeks to come.
