Mothering Sunday (The Fourth Sunday of Lent)

This weekend the Church marks Mothering Sunday. On such a day, it may be hard to read the Gospel story of Mary, Mother of Jesus, at the foot of the cross. Here we see the fulfilment of the prophecy of Simeon made to the young Mary bringing the infant lesus to the temple. 'A sword will pierce your own side too.'

In the grounds of our Diocesan Mother Church we see the sculpture of the Walking Madonna by Elizabeth Frink. It is, in contrast with other art works, such as Michelanglo's Pieta in St Peter's Rome or the tenderness of Botticelli's Madonna, a gaunt, emaciated figure. The lines in her face are etched with all the marks of suffering; this is truly a Mary who has known grief but who is unbowed. Frink is unapologetic for the realism - this is an artwork which expresses a physicality, movement, and demands engagement. For with motherhood comes immense love and commitment, but also a readiness to bear grief. And motherhood is not restricted to birth mothers, but to all those who offer us solace, compassion, guidance. For all these, we give thanks to God today.

There is a significance in the placing of this sculpture. For Frink's Mary is striding with purpose, taking the Gospel from the Cathedral out to the city. And if you spend time to watch, you see how many people approach, take her by the hand and pause awhile; a companion on the

road. In the bronze, Frink has made a figure that draws us to be comforted, empowers us to go out. Art and faith in action. Spend a while today in contemplation and wonder and thanks.

The Collect

God of compassion, whose Son Jesus Christ, the child of Mary, shared the life of a home in Nazareth, and on the cross drew the whole human family to himself: strengthen us in our daily living that in joy and in sorrow we may know the power of your presence to bind together and to heal; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

The New Testament Reading: 2 Corinthians 1.3-7

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and the God of all consolation, who consoles us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to console those who are in any affliction with the consolation with which we ourselves are consoled by God. For just as the sufferings of Christ are abundant for us, so also our consolation is abundant through Christ. If we are being afflicted, it is for your consolation and salvation; if we are being consoled, it is for your consolation, which you experience when you patiently endure the same sufferings that we are also suffering. Our hope for you is unshaken; for we know that as you share in our sufferings, so also you share in our consolation.

The Gospel: John 19.25b-27

Meanwhile, standing near the cross of Jesus were his mother, and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing beside her, he said to his mother, 'Woman, here is your son.' Then he said to the disciple, 'Here is your mother.' And from that hour the disciple took her into his own home.
