

Covid-19: Step 4

The Church of England has produced guidelines following the government guidance for Step 4. The PCC has considered these guidelines carefully, taking into account the fact that there are currently cases of Covid-19 in Tisbury and numbers are rising nationally, and has made the following decisions to ensure that we continue to keep the church as safe a space as possible. These decisions will be kept under constant review and adjusted as appropriate in the coming weeks and months.

A full risk assessment has been completed in accordance with Church of England requirements; if you would like to see a copy, please contact the Parish Administrator on tisburyparishchurch@gmail.com

- Although the wearing of masks is longer mandatory, we ask you to continue to do so in order to protect others, especially the more vulnerable.
- We shall keep social distancing measures, with alternate pews marked as unavailable. You are free, if you wish, to sit with a friend or friends in a pew marked with a green padlock. Please maintain social distancing when entering and leaving the church.
- Please continue to use hand sanitiser on entry and before receiving communion.
- We shall continue to note your name when you come to a service, so that we could contact you if there were a case of Covid-19 among the congregation.
- Congregational singing is now allowed; we ask you to keep your mask on when singing, in order to mitigate the greater risk of transmission of the virus.
- We shall continue to exchange the Peace as at present, without shaking hands.
- <u>Receiving Communion</u>. We are now able to offer wine from the chalice as well as wafers. A eucharistic assistant will be standing to one side of the Priest for this purpose. If you do not wish to receive, please simply walk past. Please do be assured that there is no pressure whatsoever on you to receive the wine; communion in one kind (wafer only) is full communion.


NB: We are not permitted to intinct (dip our wafer into the wine) as this presents a significant transmission risk.

- We shall revert to the north door as the main exit following services, although the west door will continue to be open. The Priest will be standing by the north door to greet you.
- We are delighted that we can once again offer refreshments after services. These will be available outside the north door when weather permits, otherwise in the Lady Chapel area. Please keep social distancing in mind when chatting over refreshments.

The Collect for St James' Day

Merciful God, whose holy apostle Saint James, leaving his father and all that he had, was obedient to the calling of your Son Jesus Christ and followed him even to death: help us, forsaking the false attractions of the world, to be ready at all times to answer your call without delay; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

The New Testament Reading: Acts 11.27-12.2

At that time prophets came down from Jerusalem to Antioch. One of them named Agabus stood up and predicted by the Spirit that there would be a severe famine over all the world; and this took place during the reign of Claudius. The disciples determined that according to their ability, each would send relief to the believers living in Judea; this they did, sending it to the elders by Barnabas and Saul.

About that time King Herod laid violent hands upon some who belonged to the church. He had James, the brother of John, killed with the sword.

The Gospel: Matthew 20.20–28

Then the mother of the sons of Zebedee came to him with her sons, and kneeling before him, she asked a favour of him. And he said to her, 'What do you want?' She said to him, 'Declare that these two sons of mine will sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your kingdom.' But Jesus answered, 'You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I am about to drink?' They said to him, 'We are able.' He said to them, 'You will indeed drink my cup, but to sit at my right hand and at my left, this is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared by my Father.'

When the ten heard it, they were angry with the two brothers. But Jesus called them to him and said, 'You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. It will not be so among you; but whoever wishes to be great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be your slave; just as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.'
