

The Gospel: Luke 10.29-37

A man in the crowd said to Jesus, 'I know we're told to love our neighbour as we love ourselves. But who is my neighbour?'

Jesus answered by telling a story. 'There was once a man traveling from Jerusalem to Jericho. On the way he was attacked by robbers. They took his clothes, beat him up, and went off leaving him half-dead. Luckily, a priest was on his way down the same road, but when he saw him, he sidled across to the other side. Then another religious man came by; he also avoided the injured man. A Samaritan traveling the road came upon him. When he saw the man's condition, his heart went out to him. He gave him first aid, disinfecting and bandaging his wounds. Then he lifted him onto his donkey, led him to an inn, and made him comfortable. In the morning he took out two silver coins and gave them to the innkeeper, saying, "Take good care of him. If it costs any more, put it on my bill—I'll pay you on my way back."

'What do you think?' Jesus asked. 'Which of the three became a neighbour to the man attacked by robbers?' 'The one who treated him kindly,' the man replied. Jesus said, 'Go and do the same.'
